### Joyce Jones Wolf

*Joyce Jones Wolf graduated from Stadium High School in 1949. In 1947, one of her school friends, the late great Margaret Heinrick, invited Joyce to turnout on her softball team, Lincoln Electric, coached by Telli Pagni. Joyce spent her first season of competitive softball on the bench of one of the greatest women's fast pitch team in this area.*

*At the age of 18 she joined Pacific Mutual Fuels, a team of young women who "lived and breathed softball" Joyce, who played both second and third base, played two seasons for the Fuelerettes. Each year the talented team provided some of the top individual fastpitch players players in the Tacoma circuit. The 1949 Fuelerettes placed third in the State Tournament played in Sunnyside, Wa.*

*In 1950 Joyce participated with many of those same players on the Tacoma Orphans squad, and a year later she was back with the Fuelerettes, who won 15 games while losing just one, to capture the Pierce County Women's Softball title.*

*Joyce went on to play locally for two seasons with PVT Rustlers, and for three seasons with Hollywood Boat & Motor. Jones had a great experience playing with HB&M, which competed in a high-level travel league with teams from Vancouver, BC, Portland, Ore, Utah, California, and Arizona.*

*Following her fastpitch career, Joyce became a successful player and later a coach in slowpitch softball. Joyce played 7 years with "The Gage", and Pizza Pete, before starting her coaching career. In 1974, her second year coaching, Joyce's team qualified for Nationals and traveled to Sacramento Ca., coming in 17th in the Nation.*

*Her teams qualified 3 more times for Nationals, including a trip to Chattanooga Tenn. in 1975. Joyce coached through 1982, and retired with a very successful winning record.*
