TOURNAMENT SITE – Rogers High School, 12801 – 86th Ave. East, Puyallup, WA 98373

Located at the corner of 86th Avenue East and 128th Street East, there are entrances to free parking lots on 86th Avenue and 128th Street. Team busses should enter off 86th for access to dedicated bus loading/unloading zones.

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE – Times are approximate, and may begin before published times.

- Gym open to participants and coaches – 7:30 AM (Please plan to arrive NO EARLIER than 7:30 AM)
- Weigh-In – 8:00 AM
- Coaches Meeting – Immediately following Weigh-In
- Pigtail Round – 9:00 AM
- Round 1 – 10:00 AM
- Round 2 – 12:00 PM
- Round 3 – 2:00 PM
- Round 4 – 3:30 PM
- Round 5 – 5:00 PM (Finals on two mats)

WEIGH-IN – Saturday, February 11th – 8:00 AM, Rogers High School Boys Locker Room

- **ATHLETES WILL NEED PHOTO ID AND WEIGH-IN CARDS TO WEIGH IN.** Weigh-in cards will be distributed at team check-in.
- All teams should report at weigh-in time. Weigh-in will follow Wrestling Federation Rules, and will be organized by weight class.
- Athletes will NOT be permitted to carry bags and/or gear into weigh-in, only a weigh-in card and photo ID.
- Any skin irregularities / diseases must be accompanied by a note from a physician stating the disease in non-communicable, and must be completed on NFHS form (see the WIAA website).
- There will be a physician on site. **TOURNAMENT MEDICAL STAFF WILL HAVE FINAL AUTHORITY ON ANY SKIN CONDITIONS.**
- Coaches should arrive prepared to provide a copy of their alphabetical master list from the state’s weight management program.

ROSTERS/PARTICIPANTS

COMPLETE AND E-MAIL THE REGIONAL WRESTLING PASS LIST FORM TO THE ROGERS ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT BY NO LATER THAN 12:00 PM, MONDAY, FEBRUARY 6th.

This information will be used for entry verification, programs, and for participant entrance at the Pass Gate. Any school that intends to withdraw a Regional qualifier should contact Peter Collins at (253) 961-6010 as soon as possible. This will allow time to contact the alternate qualifier.

TICKETS AND PASSES

Prices are established by the WIAA, and good for the entire Regional Tournament:

Adults & Students w/o ASB:	\$8.00
Jr./Sr. High students w/ASB, Seniors (62+), Children under 12:	\$6.00
Children under 5	Free

- Please inform your students and parents ahead of time so they come prepared to pay admission.
- Only wrestlers in uniform, participating in the tournament, will be admitted free entrance. Players will be expected to pay if not participating in tournament.
- Participant, Manager, and Coach Identification Badges will be distributed to coaches in team packets upon arrival. Badges must be worn at all times for access to the gym floor.
- Press passes will be accepted with proper identification. Only those photographers approved by the Tournament Manager will be permitted on the gym floor.
- WIAA “All Access”, “Limited Access”, and “Lifetime” passes will be accepted.
- Washington State Coaches Association and Washington Secondary School Athletic Administrators Association passes will be accepted.
- LEAGUE PASSES will NOT be accepted.
- Cheerleaders and song leaders of participating schools will be admitted free, only if in uniform.

Single Session Mat Classic tickets can be purchased at the Tacoma Dome on the day of the tournament.

COACHES MEETING

There will be a pre-tournament coaches meeting, immediately following weigh-in, held in the Hospitality Room (RHS Commons). A representative from each participating school is expected to attend. Tournament personnel will be introduced (including Tournament Manager, officials, athletic trainers, Bracket Manager, Floor Director, Stager, Announcer, and Games Committee). Last-minute changes to the tournament brackets will be announced, as well as other tournament procedures. Voting on coaches of the year will also be conducted.

OFFICIALS

Officials will be assigned by the WIAA. For matches that end in a draw, NFHS overtime rules will apply. For the Consolation & Championship finals, two officials will be used.

TOURNAMENT GAMES COMMITTEE

Any disputes occurring at the tournament will be presented to the Tournament Manager and he will confer with the Tournament Games Committee. Their decision will be final. The WIAA expulsion rule (23.32 – Conduct eligibility rules and penalties) will be followed.

The Tournament Games Committee will contain:

- Head Official
- Tournament Manager
- Floor Director
- Two coaches from neutral schools

STATE QUALIFIERS/AWARDS

The first five (5) place finishers in each weight class will qualify for the State Tournament to be held in the Tacoma Dome, February 17-18. The 6th place finisher will become the alternate to the State Tournament. The alternate will be used in the event of a scratch by a higher placer for their region only.

Medals will be awarded to the first five (5) place finishers in each weight class. Individual awards will be presented during the Finals session. Pictures for the state tournament program of the top five (5) place finishers will be taken immediately after the awards presentation for that weight class. **WRESTLERS MUST WEAR THEIR SCHOOL WARM-UP FOR THE PHOTO.**

LOCKER ROOMS

- Wrestlers deposit all debris in trash cans.
- P. E. lockers are not disturbed.
- Bulletin boards are left untouched.
- Coaches is responsible for the conduct of their team and should discuss proper care of locker room area.
- Each school is responsible for their valuables. Secured storage will not be available.
- Each school must furnish their own towels

GYM FLOOR RESTRICTIONS

- Only participants and coaches will be allowed on the main gym floor. Spectators will sit in the general seating area, in each balcony.
- Teams are limited to two coaches per mat during a match.
- Only four (4) cheerleaders may cheer at mat side at any one time.
- Only those photographers approved by the Tournament Manager will be permitted on the gym floor. Video equipment is limited to the balcony bleachers.

MEDICAL/FIRST AID – Certified athletic trainers will be available.

SIGNS – No signs except official school banners will be permitted.

BANDS AND NOISEMAKERS – School pep bands and artificial noisemakers will NOT be permitted.

TOURNAMENT SCORING

All tournament scoring will be conducted as stated in the NFHS Rule Book (Rule 9, Section 2). Team points will be awarded when a school has a wrestler place in the top six (6) places:

- First Place 16 team points
- Second Place 12 team points
- Third Place 9 team points
- Fourth Place 7 team points
- Fifth Place 5 team points
- Sixth Place 3 team points

Individual placement points shall be awarded as soon as earned. Placement points already earned will be deducted in case of forfeit (other than injury) or disqualification from the tournament. Points for team scoring shall be awarded as follows:

- Two (2) team advancement points shall be scored for each match won in the championship bracket, except for the final first place match. If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round, he shall be awarded two (2) advancement points for that round if he wins his next match. No points are awarded for the bye if the wrestler loses his next match.
- One (1) team advancement point shall be scored for each match won in the consolation round, except for the final third and fifth place matches. A wrestler who has a bye in the consolation round shall receive one (1) advancement point, provided he wins the next round match.
- Two (2) additional points will be scored for each match won by default, disqualification, fall, or forfeit throughout the tournament.
- One and one-half (1.5) points will be awarded for each match won by a technical fall.
- One (1) point will be awarded for each match won by a major decision.
- The winner of each championship quarterfinal shall be awarded three (3) points, and the winner of each championship final shall be awarded four (4) additional place points. The winner of the quarterfinal consolation match shall receive three (3) additional place points. The winner of the third place match and the winner of the fifth place match shall receive two (2) additional place points.

OTHER TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

The current WIAA Handbook and NFHS WRESTLING RULE BOOK will be used. Any matter not covered in either book will be left to the discretion of the tournament games committee.
